

## **ALEXANDRA BATSIOS**

Soprano



Hailed as a "coloratura tour de force" (Opera News) and possessing a "powerful, searing soprano" (Opera Now), Alexandra Batsios is garnering attention as an important operatic talent. In 2023 the soprano enjoyed a critically acclaimed role debut in the title role of *Alcina* with St. Petersburg Opera with whom she sang *Tosca* in 2022. 2021 credits include appearances at The Princeton Festival and excerpts from *Thais* and *Esclarmonde* with Maryland Opera. Ms. Batsios sang Konstanze in *Die Entführung aus dem Serail* with several companies, including Livermore Valley Opera, St. Petersburg Opera, and Opera North (NH). Her debut as Königen der Nacht in *Die Zauberflöte* at Sarasota Opera earned critical praise for her "vocal fire" (Herald-Tribune) and "sniper-like accuracy" (Your Observer).

Additional credits include Leonora in *II trovatore* with St. Petersburg Opera, the Queen of Shemakha in *The Golden CockereI* with New Opera NYC and Sarasota Opera. Alexandra Batsios was a studio artist with the Sarasota and Palm Beach Operas. She has been heard as Adele in *Die Fledermaus*, Berta in *II barbiere di Siviglia*, Hélène in Verdi's *Jérusalem*, Annina in *La Traviata*, Clorinda in *La Cenerentola*, Flora in *The Turn of the Screw* and the role of Yadwiga in Ben Moore's *Enemies*, *A Love Story*.

Concert engagements include Mahler's *2<sup>nd</sup> Symphony* with the Florida Orchestra and Beethoven's *Ninth Symphony* with the Princeton Symphony Orchestra, Westminster Choir College and Dartmouth Symphony Orchestra. At the Newport Music Festival she appeared as a soprano soloist in Vivaldi's *Gloria* and Pergolesi's *Stabat Mater*. Additional concert repertoire includes Mozart's *Requiem* and *Grand Mass in C minor*, Orff's *Carmina Burana*, Bach's *Magnificat*. She has sung under the batons of Alan Gilbert, John Adams, Helmuth Rilling, Sir Roger Norrington and Michael Tilson Thomas. Alexandra Batsios is the soprano soloist on Westminster Choir's CD *Noël*, a collaboration of French Christmas music featuring mezzo-soprano Jennifer Larmore.

Awards include the Sullivan Foundation and Gerda Lissner Foundation Competitions, third place in the Midwest regional of the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions, a Graduate Performance award from Sigma Alpha Iota, and encouragement awards from the Giulio Gari Foundation, Licia Albanese-Puccini Foundation, and Violetta DuPont Vocal Competition. She holds performance degrees from Millikin University and Westminster Choir College.
